## Thousands of Capetonians celebrate Afr'energy at the 2023 Cape Town Carnival

Tens of thousands of Capetonians lined the streets to witness the colourful spectacle of the floats, dancers, music and energy, and they weren't disappointed. Spectacular, phenomenal, and inspiring were just some of the words used to describe the event.

A variety of participating community groups and performers showcased a year's worth of preparations in celebration of South African culture and creativity as the parade made its way down the Fan Walk on Green Point's Somerset Road.

At the event's Opening Ceremony, Deputy Mayor of the City of Cape Town, Eddie Andrews, called on Capetonians to share the spirit of Afr'energy, saying, "Many of the people gathered here this evening are foreigners, so let's make sure we say hello and give them a warm South African welcome. Forty- six community groups from across the Western Cape participated in the parade, showcasing their individual talents but all reflecting the 2023 theme of 'Afr'energy'. They include Cape Town Carnival favourites such as the Western Province Marching Band, Chinese Community and Bulumko High School, as well as 17 new community groups.

"Seeing Capetonians flock to the Carnival in their droves tonight reminded us how meaningful this event is to the City, and reminds us why we continue to serve our community of performers and sponsors," said Cape Town Carnival Board Chair Prof Rachel Jafta.
